# **VESSEL ACCIDENT/INCIDENT INFORMATION**

In South Australia owners and operators of vessels are required to report an accident or incident which results in loss of life, personal injury or property damage of more than \$300 to the CE or an authorised person (Police Officer or a Marine Safety Officer) as soon as possible but within 48 hours.

If you observe or are involved in an accident or incident you should record the following details at the time of the incident. It is important to gather this information to enable the completion of an accident report at a later time, however personal safety must remain the highest priority. You can visit www.sa.gov.au/topics/boating-and-marine/boat-and-marine-safety to report your vessel accident/incident online.
